



Director's Notes

For those of you I don't know or who are new to Statesmen Theatre, this is my final show at Marshall High School. I have been the theatre director here for the past 6 years, and directed shows at West Springfield & Thoreau Middle School before that. I am proud that I've done musicals that few FCPS high schools have done in my 16 years, from Merrily We Roll Along to A Year With Frog & Toad to last year's zany Xanadu—all great shows that no other school has touched during my tenure. I'm equally happy I got to introduce three Rodgers & Hammerstein classics to new generations of theatregoers: Cinderella, Oklahoma! (twice) and The Sound of Music. I'm extremely proud that we put up the DC premiere of Be More Chill in my first year here before it went to Broadway. Just as cool, during the pandemic, some brilliant kids came together and made a filmed version of the musical Working that required all sorts of innovation and moxie. My philosophy has always been if you're a student with me for 4 years, you should have a breadth of different experiences. Check. Done.

So why then, you might ask, did I choose THIS show for my final high school show? A modern show that so many kids know backwards and forwards? I will readily admit that Legally Blonde was not on my bucket list. But I'd pretty much done all of the passion project shows I wanted to do. And the kids had been really good sports about me choosing material they'd never heard of. So my mind was unusually open this time.

Each year I give kids the opportunity to pitch me musicals—and there are plenty of shows I will knock down right away (Grease, Les Miserables, Phantom of the Opera, Mamma Mia—NOPE, not on my watch!) I'm pretty binary in my tastes—I either really LOVE a show, or I absolutely can't stand it. Rarely do they fall in the middle. But when Sophia Welch pitched me Legally Blonde really hard, I listened. I actually liked the original movie a lot. When I pitched it to Ms. Powell, she had the same reaction I did: "I don't hate it." And so I gave it a hard look last summer. When I saw the Barbie movie with my wife & daughter (which I loved), I realized they were very similar stories with a compelling & current theme: a young woman living in a protected (and pink) bubble travels to a rough-and-tumble real world where she grows and achieves a new level of self-actualization and empowerment. And that helped to sell me on this show. I have taught & mentored so many amazing, talented young women, and it's been a thrill to watch them tackle challenges & soar. What a positive message to go out with!

I also wanted to do something for my seniors as a last show together. Confession: I wanted to leave at the end of last year. I was exhausted and completely burned out. But this senior class was special to me. They started as freshmen during that horrible online COVID year. We went through that fire together, and I just couldn't leave them. And I wanted to do something THEY wanted to do (for once). And here we are.

So thank you for attending and supporting this program over the years. The program will go on without me, and I'm excited to see the new heights that it'll reach with my successor! I will look back on my time at Marshall and with these kids quite fondly.

You bring us so much joy, both on and off the stage.
